A monogram is a motif of two or more letters, typically a person's initials, usually interwoven into a decorative design, which is used as a logo or to identify a personal possession. In Rome and Greece it was used as a royal signature of seal of currency. In the Middle Ages, artisans used them to personalize their work. In the Victorian era, monograms began as a symbol of aristocracy but soon became standard for every household. What was initially a form of identification evolved into a personal or family emblem. Students will be introduced to a variety of typographic letters with which they will be able to create their own monograms. Time-permitting, they may add decorative elements to emulate illuminated initials. Come join us, and MAKE YOUR OWN MARK!
